A Ministry of Reconciliation: Based on Malachi 4:6, Malachi Dads restores the hearts of fathers to their children and children to their fathers. Sixty volunteers from 11 local churches lead small groups in prisons—much like home Bible studies—where men learn to become godly fathers, husbands, and leaders using Christian books.

Who Can Volunteer? Everyday Christian men willing to share God's Word with men eager to grow in Christ. No experience needed—the books guide the discussions.



Why Volunteer? Prisoners are often forgotten, yet Jesus said: "I was in prison, and you visited me" (Matt. 25:36). Many inmates have no visitors, so your visit is deeply meaningful. For many volunteers, this night becomes the highlight of their week.


What to Expect: Meetings are held in the prison chapel. You will meet with the same group of men and bonds of trust will
